- are interested in furthering your governance skills;
- are able to commit to a board for a minimum of 12 months.

- attend Committee/Board meetings as required;
- participate as a board member in all aspects but will have no voting rights and will not form part of the quorum of a board meeting.

Selection Process

Two Associate Directors will be selected through the following process:

1. Applications to be received by 3:00pm on Friday 14 May 2021.
2. Selection Committee will review the applications and shortlist candidates for interview by 28 May 2021.
3. Candidate assessments will be provided to the Committee of Management for final selection.
4. Successful candidates will be notified, complete induction process and be appointed in July 2021.
5. Associate Directors will be placed on relevant Boards or Sub-Committees for a period of 12 months.
6. Remuneration to be advised.

As a Māori Incorporation, under the Māori Incorporations Constitution Regulations 1994, NWTL is unable to appoint someone who is or becomes:

- Unable to satisfactorily carry out tasks involved;
- An undischarged bankrupt;
- A person convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment for a term of six months or longer, unless he or she has served the sentence or suffered the penalty imposed.
